My name is Tammy Logston, I'm a resident of Grays Lake Community, and my husband's family has owned this property for approximately 100 years. I am writing my objections to the permitting or leasing of the drill site Federal 20-3 to CPC Minerals.

These objections include:

1. Increase risk of contamination of area ground water and my personal wells for livestock and household
2. Increased air and noise pollution from the drill site, associated equipment and traffic, including gases burned off
3. CPC Minerals LLC history of poor compliance with its previous drill sites in this area, including: permitting issues, water overuse from Grays Lake outlet, the previous well site "cleanup" which occurred only after the current surface owner was forced to contact State and Federal agencies providing oversight to pressure timely toxic waste removal.
4. Local property and mineral owners assurance and verification that CPC Minerals will not draw off resources from uncommitted mineral owners using diagonal drilling. This is especially pertinent after Mr. Philip Clegg and an associate sat in my home and told my husband and myself that "We should lease them (CPC) our mineral rights, or they would drill under our property and get them anyway."
5. I have been told; "This experimental fracking is good for Idaho". **My neighbor inquired about leasing his mineral rights and was refused because: "This was NOT in Idaho's best interest"**. How is allowing CPC Minerals the opportunity for experimental fracking in and around the Gray's Lake Wilderness area good for Idaho? Why wouldn't this industrial experiment be performed where known oil and gas reserves are currently taking place to approve its efficacy under current oil and gas standards or best practices? Why wouldn't this be done in a region/state where the safety measures and permitting processes are already established to limit and/or prevent environmental and personal property damage or pollution? Isn't looking after the residents of Idaho, their personal property and the wonderful wilderness resources that you would find in Grays Lake in the **BEST** interest of Idaho?

Thank you for your consideration to my very serious concerns on the actions of CPC Minerals if they are permitted to continue these experiments in my community.
