I am writing in opposition to North Idaho Marine’s application for Dock building access in the eastern end of Wolf Lodge .

This use of Lake Coeur d’alene surface is of direct benefit to a small percentage of the local work force and economy. North Idaho Marine and their employers have existing locations from which to conduct business. Their business would be able to continue using their dock building sites currently established and in use.

The construction of the Wolf Lodge NIM business site would be a significant disruption and additional risk to Highway 97 traffic . Upon completion, the Proposed use of the Mineral Ridge Boat ramp as NIM truck and equipment turnaround would disrupt the use of the intended purpose of the ramp for recreation, fishing and boating access.

If conservation,scenic value and public highway safety are not to be considered, perhaps our local capitalism should be. Lake Coeur d’alene and the surrounding communities have an economy based on tourism . Our area sells itself as a recreational haven for vacation, scenic lake access and a desirably clean environ.

Thriving vacation communities such as Gozzer Ranch rely on the marketability of beautiful scenic lifestyle. We do not attract people through the singular economic expansion requests of one company.

Granting the lake surface use to North Idaho Marine is economically helpful to only a few. It is a discernible disadvantage to many who depend on the preservation of Lake Coeur d’alene for income and recreation and lifestyle.
