Gentlepeople,

I testified at the hearing in-person when the original proposal on Trestle Creek was made. I cannot make the hearing tonight or tomorrow because I am sick. Below are my official comments:

I am OPPOSED to the proposal in all of its modifications. As the author of *Legendary Lake Pend Oreille*, published by Keokee Books and the comprehensive book about our lake and area, including 50 pages of this 450 page book on the Kalispel Tribe, vetted by the Tribal Council. You must <u>deny</u> this application in its entirety. Inform the applicant that it is inappropriate for several reasons, for cultural reasons (pg. 164 of my book) — "The area from Pack River to Hope is one of two (the other being the Clark Fork Delta) of the most important locations on Lake Pend Oreille to the Tribe because of nature's abundance of fish and wildlife." Trestle Creek specifically was both fished in spring as well as summer and fall. Deer and bear were hunted in the adjacent mountains. This place was one of the most important hunting and fishing camps for both the Upper and Lower Bands of Kalispel.

My suggestion is that the applicant gift the land they now own to the Kalispel Tribe on behalf of all the native and nonnative people who live here, and that IDL support this idea. We simply don't know when to leave sacred and special wild habitats undeveloped, especially Trestle Creek, home to spawning kokanee salmon.

Nothing about this proposal is positive and should be denied in its entirety. Rich people coming in don't know when to quit ruining our lake with their toys, their marinas and their ostentatious homes. This Lake Pend Oreille was lived around and cared for for 10,000 years. Trestle Creek is also a public area for the rest of us which I write about in my book as well. So many people enjoy kayaking this undeveloped and beautiful area.

Secondly you must deny this proposal because of its negative impacts to nature. I'm writing now as an advocate and an environmental podcaster, public radio producer (mythweaver.org) and protector of the wildlife in this area. Non-human beings have no voice with IDL and the developers don't care about wildlife one bit; they only care about themselves and money.
