Subject: Developing Trestle Creek is bad for LPO

To whom it concerns,

Lake Pend Oreille is a public good, and the Idaho Club's proposal to develop Trestle Creek would negatively impact far more lake users than would be benefitted

I do not support the proposed development of a Trestle Creek marina by the Idaho Club (application #L-96-S-2798A) in any way.

Trestle Creek is the primary spawning location on Lake Pend Oreille for bull trout, a threatened species. Loss of this spawning ground could permanently endanger bull trout populations in LPO.

Hardening nearly a mile of natural shoreline impacts critical habitat for fry and fingerling of all fish species, as well as birds and mammals like muskrat, beavers, mink, deer and moose.

The construction of seven luxury homes and the accompanying lawns will degrade water quality by introducing excess nutrients and encouraging algae growth. This is already a problem along the lakeshore.

Many people who recreate on Lake Pend Oreille and its tributaries are sportspeople. The development of Trestle Creek is not in the interest of any angler or hunter. Conversely, it's only in the interest of the Idaho Club to develop its marina.

Regular Idahoans are tired of subsidizing private development. And that's what this project would be, if permitted. Regular people, who hunt and fish to fill their freezers, who enjoy not swimming in slimy green water, and who otherwise rely on the water quality of the Lake, would cede what is a public good to the Idaho Club--a private interest--should this development happen.

We were instrumental in stopping a proposed \$350 million silicon metal smelter with its 760 million tons per year of toxic greenhouse gases from siting in our county less than 1 mile from our city center. This proposed development at Trestle Creek will not only undermine the very recovery of threatened bull trout, it will kill the bull trout and other aquatic life. The additional noise alone is a serious threat and invasion to all the species that live in the marshes and wetlands. Trestle Creek is one of the few places where families can easily observe spawning bull trout and kokanee salmon. Subject: Marina proposal for Pack River Delta

I object to and ask that the Idaho Department of Lands deny a request for development of an 88 boat marina on the lower Pack River Delta.

As the great grand daughter of a man who came to Idaho in the mid 1890s, I grew up hearing my grandfather tell stories about his experiences that came from exploring the mountains, creeks, and shoreline of Lake Pend Oreille.

He recalled skies so thick with waterfowl that they appeared black. He caught bull trout with his hands in the creeks near Trestle Creek.

As a child, the Pack River Delta and shorelines in that area were an endless source of entertainment, recreation and food. We fished both sides of Highway 200 at the Delta for catfish and bass, and watched turtles emerge from shells in the stream banks.

As an adult, I've encountered moose in marshy areas of the delta and watched otters playing in the delta waters.

To remove portions of the delta to make way for an 88-boat Marina, pedestrian bridge, parking lot, breakwater, seven private homes and accompanying docks to this area. It is my understanding that this proposal does not include restroom facilities and I also assume that it would include services for fueling boats. It also is my understanding that the proposal calls for half of the soil to be remove from this area.

I object to this proposal and any modifications that might be suggested to make it more palatable. Nothing makes this proposal palatable. This proposal would benefit a small group of people - developers, homeowners and those who would be paying expensive Marina fees.

I object because I know the Marina would degrade water quality, which in turn would harm the delta's wildlife from large to small, including insects, with a loss of .9 to 2.5 percent a year (Wikipedia). The delta is home to dragonflies and butterflies, plus turtles and hundreds of bird species. Marshes are critical to cleaning environments. By removing the delta through dredging, how many native bees and pollinators will be destroyed? By removing the soil, pollinators will no longer have a place to nest, hibernate and return year after year. Bumblebees need holes in the ground created by mice to nest during the winter. Protecting these wild spaces is critical for our own survival.

This proposed project is not critical for this habitat or our community. Just because the developer brought the property and has big ideas does not mean that they should receive approval for it. The developer shows complete disregard and concern for this community with this proposal as it does not respect the environment of this beautiful and wild space.

The Idaho Department of Lands' responsibility is to protect the lands and waters, not the investment of a developer.

Vote no to this and any amendments in the proposal.
